"The Trust created this scholarship program specifically for these individuals, making sacrifices and taking risks toward a better future for themselves and the profession."

When asked what this scholarship meant to her, Nia Collins shared that this scholarship will take her one step closer to being able to "make a difference in the community by providing insight, comfort and compassion." Commitment to community is a value shared by recipient Courtney Richards. "I have a very strong desire to continue educating my community more on the different forms of memorialization."

Recipient Kami Gremillion is focused on her goals for the future. "My goal, through the funeral service education I am receiving, is to learn the skills necessary to comfort and help families navigate the storm

that follows the death of a loved one. This is an extremely important task/gift, not to be taken lightly, and my motivation to pursue this path toward a more fulfilling life's work."

Second-Career Scholarships are awarded by the Selected Educational Trust to individuals who have chosen funeral service later in their career journey and currently are attending mortuary school. Since this program was launched in 2010, the Trust has awarded 53 scholarships, totaling more than \$75,000 in tuition scholarships awarded to students pursuing mortuary sciences as a second career.
